SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY

Burleson Collegiate High School is a comprehensive four-year public high school in Johnson County, Texas, located in a residential suburb of Fort Worth. The school district serves over 10,000 students in three high schools, 3 middle schools, and 10 elementary schools. The school opened in the fall of 2016 and will graduate the first senior class in spring 2020. Burleson Collegiate High School is accredited by the Texas Education Agency and holds membership in the College Board.

Demographics: African-American - 6%, Hispanic - 28 %, White - 57%, 2 or more multicultural - 7%.

CURRICULUM FEATURES

The academic program is organized on a block schedule. Nine credits per academic year is the maximum course load. Students take four 1 hour and 20 minute classes per day, Monday-Thursday. On Friday, students take six 1 hour classes. Pre-AP courses offered: English 1, English 2, Algebra 1, Geometry, World Geography, Biology. Dual credit courses offered: Music appreciation.

Burleson Collegiate has 6 professional faculty members. All staff members are highly qualified. 66% of the staff holds a Master's Degree.

CLASS RANK AND GRADE POINT AVERAGE

GPA is computed on a 4 point scale. Due to weighted PAP and Dual credit courses, (.5 is added to the final mark) the final grade point average may exceed 4.0. Beginning with grade nine, all subjects, whether passed or failed, are included in the computation. A minimum of 26 credits is required for graduation. PAP and Dual credit courses are weighted. Grades are recorded on the transcript and GPA is computed in January and May. Senior class honor students shall be designated at the end of the fifth six-week period of the senior year.

Honor Graduate Designations Based on 4.0 scale:

Honor Graduates shall be determined in accordance with the following provisions:

1. All courses taken in residence during the regular term shall be included in computing honors.
2. Students shall be preliminarily ranked at the end of the seventh semester for college admission purposes. GPA shall be officially calculated at the end of the fifth six weeks of the senior year.
3. Latin Honors will be bestowed as follows:
 - a. **Summa Cum Laude** - graduation under the Distinguished Achievement Program with a 3.5 GPA or higher.
 - b. **Magna Cum Laude** - graduation under the Distinguished Achievement Program with a 3.0 GPA to a 3.49 GPA or graduation under the Recommended Program with a 3.5 GPA or higher.
 - c. **Cum Laude** - graduation under the Recommended Program with a 3.25 GPA to a 3.49 GPA.
